A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE ILLINOIS OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY BY THE FAYETTE COUNTY BOARD.

WHEREAS, Fayette County, Illinois, (herein the "County"), by and through its elected County Board, has determined that it is in the County's and its constituents' best interest that the County take an expressed position in support of the Oil and Gas Industry (herein the "Industry") in Fayette County; and,

WHEREAS, The Industry provides revenue to the County through sales and real estate taxes, employment for many of its citizens, and patronage of businesses; and,


WHEREAS, the County supports and encourages the development and growth of the Industry.

Fayette County Oil Production Industry Fact Sheet



- More than 649,000 barrels of oil were produced in Fayette County in 2018, making it the fifth largest producing county in the state.
- Ad valorem tax revenue from Fayette County oil production totaled more than **\$3.1 million** from 2007-2017. More than half that revenue went to fund public schools in the county. ^{2 3}
- The oil production industry employs between 100-300 people in Fayette County.
- These jobs are critical considering Fayette County's **poverty rate is 16.1%**, four percentage points higher than the national average. ⁵


Get the Facts:

The Illinois Oil Industry's Economic Impact

Illinois oil production has generated steady employment, income and revenue for the Land of Lincoln through good economic times and bad for more than 110 years. These contributions are all the more critical considering Illinois' current dire financial situation. **Here are the facts:**



Illinois' oil production industry has created more than 14,000 jobs in the Land of Lincoln, including more than 4,000 direct jobs. Most of the direct jobs are concentrated in the southern portion of the state where oil production is a major contributor to local employment.



Illinois oil production has an overall direct economic impact in the state of more than \$3 billion per year. Income impacts are substantial and include a direct impact of \$769M.



Illinois oil production generates \$330M annually in direct revenue for the state via business taxes, production taxes and income taxes. It generates more than \$700 million in overall annual tax revenue when federal taxes are taken into account.



Ad valorem taxes on Illinois oil production generated \$57.4M in revenue for public schools and municipalities from 2007 to 2013 (the latest year that data is available.)

More than half of that revenue went to fund K-12 education in producing counties.





Illinois' oil production industry generates \$770M in personal and business income annually. More than 30,000 leaseholders and residents also receive royalty income from Illinois oil production, while more than 1,000 Illinois operators and support businesses — mostly small, locally owned businesses and independent contractors — receive income from production.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>2019-06-11-B</u>

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ANIMAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Fayette County, Illinois (the "County"), has heretofore been duly organized and is now operating as a county under the provisions of the Illinois Counties Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, 55 ILCS 5 defines the responsibility of Fayette County in the proper administration of an Animal Control Program; and,

WHEREAS, a program suitable to provide adequate protections for residents of Fayette County is complex and requires close coordination with multiple municipalities; and

WHEREAS, a review of County Board committees found inadequate accountabilities for monitoring the Animal Control Program; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that a standing committee for Animal Control be added to the Organization Table of the Fayette County Board.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Animal Control committee shall have three members, one of which shall serve as the Chairman and that said Chairman shall be appointed by the Fayette County Board Chairman with consent of the Fayette County Board.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Animal Control Committee shall meet post haste to ensure the Fayette Animal Control Program is in full compliance with Illinois Statutes and Fayette County Ordinances.
