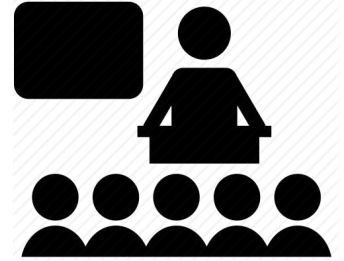

**Clay County** has consistently been a top-10 oil producing county in Illinois for many years. More than [308,000 barrels](#) of oil were produced in the county in 2018, eighth-most in the state. Clay County's oil production industry generated more than **\$5.39 million** in property tax revenue from 2007-2017. IPRB conservatively estimates that at least **\$2.69 million** of that property tax revenue primarily went to fund the three school districts based in the county: Flora Community Unit School District (CUSD) #5, North Clay CUSD #25 and Clay City CUSD #10.
