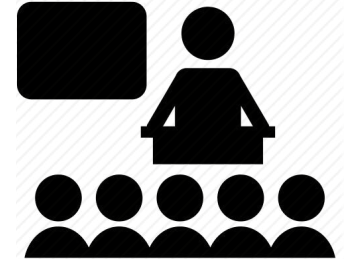

**Marion County** has been one of Illinois' top oil producing counties since the late 1930s and has consistently been Illinois' second largest producing county at **nearly one million barrels** per year over the past decade. This production generated more than **\$13.8 million** in property tax revenue for the county from 2007 to 2018. IPRB conservatively estimates that at least **\$6.9 million** of that revenue primarily went to fund the 15 public school districts based in Marion County and those districts' approximately 6,900 total students.
