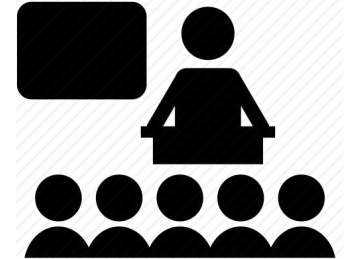

**Richland County** has long been a significant oil producing county in Illinois and was 10th in the state in production in 2018 at more than [245,000 barrels](#). The county's reliable oil production generated more than **\$3.8 million** in property tax revenue from 2007-2018. IPRB conservatively estimates that at least **\$1.9 million** of that total primarily went to fund the county's school districts during that time, Olney-East Richland Community School District #1 and West Richland CUSD #2. Those school districts merged to become a single school district in 2015.
