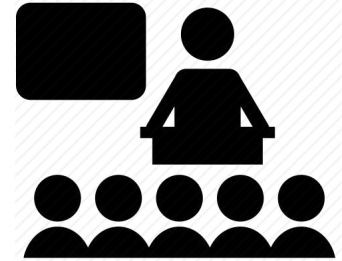

Though tiny in terms of geography (228 square miles) and population (11,489), Wabash County has been a major Illinois oil producing county for decades. Wabash County was **sixth in the state in oil production** in 2018 ([411,566 barrels](#)). Oil reserves in Wabash County generated **\$4.61 million** in property tax revenue from 2007-2018, meaning at least **\$2.3 million** was generated for the county's two primary school districts - Wabash Community CUSD #348 and Allendale CUSD #17 - and their approximately 1,690 K-12 students during that time-frame.
