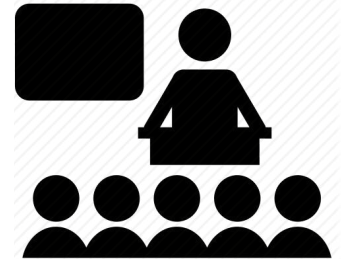

Wayne County has long been a top-10 oil producing county in Illinois, totaling 327,000 barrels in 2019, seventh-most among the state's 42 producing counties. IPRB estimates Wayne County's oil production industry generated more than **\$6.0 million** in property tax revenue from 2007-2019 and conservatively estimates that at least **\$3.0 million** of that revenue primarily went to fund the county's seven public school districts and their combined 2,539 K-12 students.
