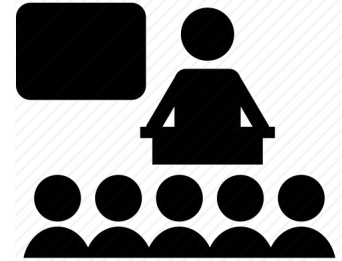

Though tiny in terms of geography (228 square miles) and population (11,489), Wabash County has been a major Illinois oil producing county for decades. Wabash County was sixth in the state in oil production in 2020 (363,265 barrels). Oil reserves in Wabash County generated \$5 million-plus in property tax revenue from 2007-2020, meaning at least \$2.5 million was generated for the county's two primary school districts - Wabash Community CUSD #348 and Alton CUSD #17 - and their approximately 1,690 K-12 students.
