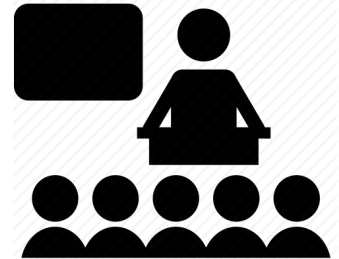

Fayette County has consistently been one of Illinois' top-five oil producing counties since the discovery of the historic Loudon field in the 1930s. Fayette County oil reserves continue to generate significant property tax revenue, totaling \$3.77 million-plus from 2007-2021. Fifty-nine to 60 percent of that total has gone to fund schools near production during that timespan. IPRB estimates that \$2.25 million of that revenue primarily went to fund the St. Elmo School District, with significant funding also going to the South Central and Brownstown school districts as well.
